Lewis reminds us that God is not deceived by externals.

Jesus said of the Pharisees, "But do not do what they do, for they do not practice what they preach." (Matthew 23:3b) "Everything they do is done for men to see: . . . " (Matthew 23:5a)

We are to do good deeds! But are they done to get the recognition of our fellowman or from a true love of serving our Lord? What is our true motivation? Is it true and genuine or is it an artificial motivation?


